SUBJECT: AGENDA ITEM G: CONCEPT DEVELOPMENT, Service considerations, and initial evaluation Results

At the June 20, 2023, Equity Advisory Council (EAC) meeting, there will be a presentation related to concept development work, including service considerations and initial evaluation results. This memo provides background on the topic and the attachment outlines the some of the high-level evaluation findings regarding the current concepts being explored.

BACKGROUND

Reminder: Definitions

- <u>Business Case</u>: A way to identify and evaluate the benefits, costs, and risks of the Link21 Program
- <u>Co-Creation:</u> A type of equitable engagement in which the Link21 Team partners with community-based organizations to host collaborative and interactive workshops where individuals from communities that have been marginalized help define important parts of Link21 work. Co-creation was key to defining work such as Link21's goals, objectives, equity metrics, priority populations definition, and community mobility needs.
- <u>Metric:</u> A way to measure something. In the Business Case, metrics help provide an understanding of how well concepts accomplish Link21's goals and objectives.
 - <u>Equity Metrics</u>: Metrics that show the benefit specifically to priority populations, in addition to the benefit to the whole population. These metrics were determined through co-creation, as communities that have been marginalized identified what outcomes were the most important to them. The initial evaluation includes five equity metrics (below). More outcomes emphasized by communities will be added as equity metrics in the next evaluation as Link21's tools advance.
 - Average perceived travel time savings; number of daily new rail trips; number of people within 0.5 miles of a new rail station; number of jobs reachable



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within what feels like a 60-,90-, and 120-minute trip; and number of important regional community resources reachable within what feels like a 60-,90-, and 120-minute trip.

- <u>Equity Indicator</u>: Way to measure different aspects of equity. Indicators are used to measure how equitable the results of equity metrics are. Two key equity indicators are the total amount of benefits for priority populations and the share (percent) of benefits for priority populations.
 - Total amount of benefits example: 3,500 new rail trips are taken by priority populations.
 - Share of benefits example: 38.5% of all new rail trips are taken by priority populations. Two reference points that can be helpful when looking at the share of benefits are:
 - 32.4%: the percent of the Megaregion's population that lives in priority populations.
 - 40%: the goal for the percentage of "overall benefits of certain Federal investments [that will] flow to disadvantaged communities that are marginalized, underserved, and overburdened by pollution" under the Biden-Harris Administration's Justice40 Initiative.
- <u>Link21 & Northern California Megaregion</u>: Link21 refers to the 21-county area covering the Northern California Megaregion that includes the San Francisco Bay Area, Sacramento Area, Northern San Joaquin Valley, and Monterey Bay Area.
- Priority populations: The census tracts where residents experience the most economic, mobility, community, and health & safety burdens. Communities were important partners in creating the priority populations definition. Through co-creation workshops and a poll of low-income individuals and people of color, over 1,800 people helped shape what burdens were included in the priority populations definition. Almost one-third (32.4%) of the Megaregion's population lives in priority populations.
- <u>Technology:</u> Type of train that will use the crossing
